### KEY POINTS

- Updated Aug. 26 HMC's 4-Stage COVID-19 Management Plan 4.3
- PPE Inventory report updated weekly
- April 9, everyone entering the hospital is required to wear a mask
- Elective surgeries and procedures resumed April 27 with testing requirement
- June 1, patient visitation resumed on a limited basis
- June 1-4, over 1,500 employees in our East Hawaii hospitals and clinics were tested for COVID-19 – all were negative
- Drive-through testing at Hilo Medical Center concluded on July 2 with 1,703 tests conducted over 16 weeks.
- As of July 3, testing responsibilities transferred back to primary care providers and outpatient COVID-19 testing sites operated by Clinical Labs for asymptomatic patients. For symptomatic patients, screening and testing are available at Puna Community Medical Center, Hilo Medical Center's Emergency Department, and Urgent Care clinics.
- July 1, traveler healthcare workers are required to have a negative test prior to reporting to work
- COVID-19 Testing Requirements for initial entry and out of state travel guidelines, updated August 11
- Random COVID-19 testing of 196 employees took place August 12 & 13 came back all negative
- August 21, stood up our COVID Unit
- August 25, expanded COVID Unit
